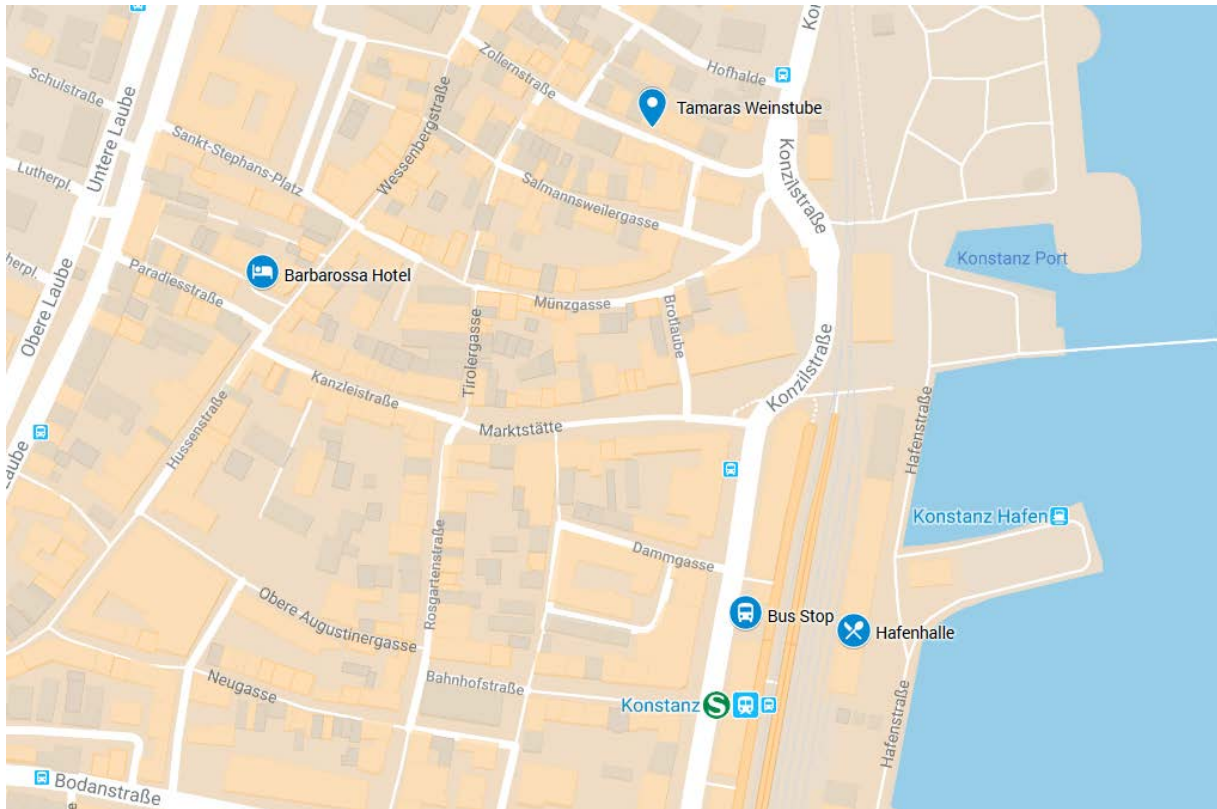

Getting Around



Your Hotel (Barbarossa) is in walking distance from the train station (where you will arrive), the wine bar (Tamaras), and the dinner restaurant (Hafenhalle).

To get to the University you can take either a 9A or a 9B bus at the bus stop in front of the train station (direction: Universität) and get off at the final stop. Note that there might only be a bus every 15min. The ride lasts about 20min.
